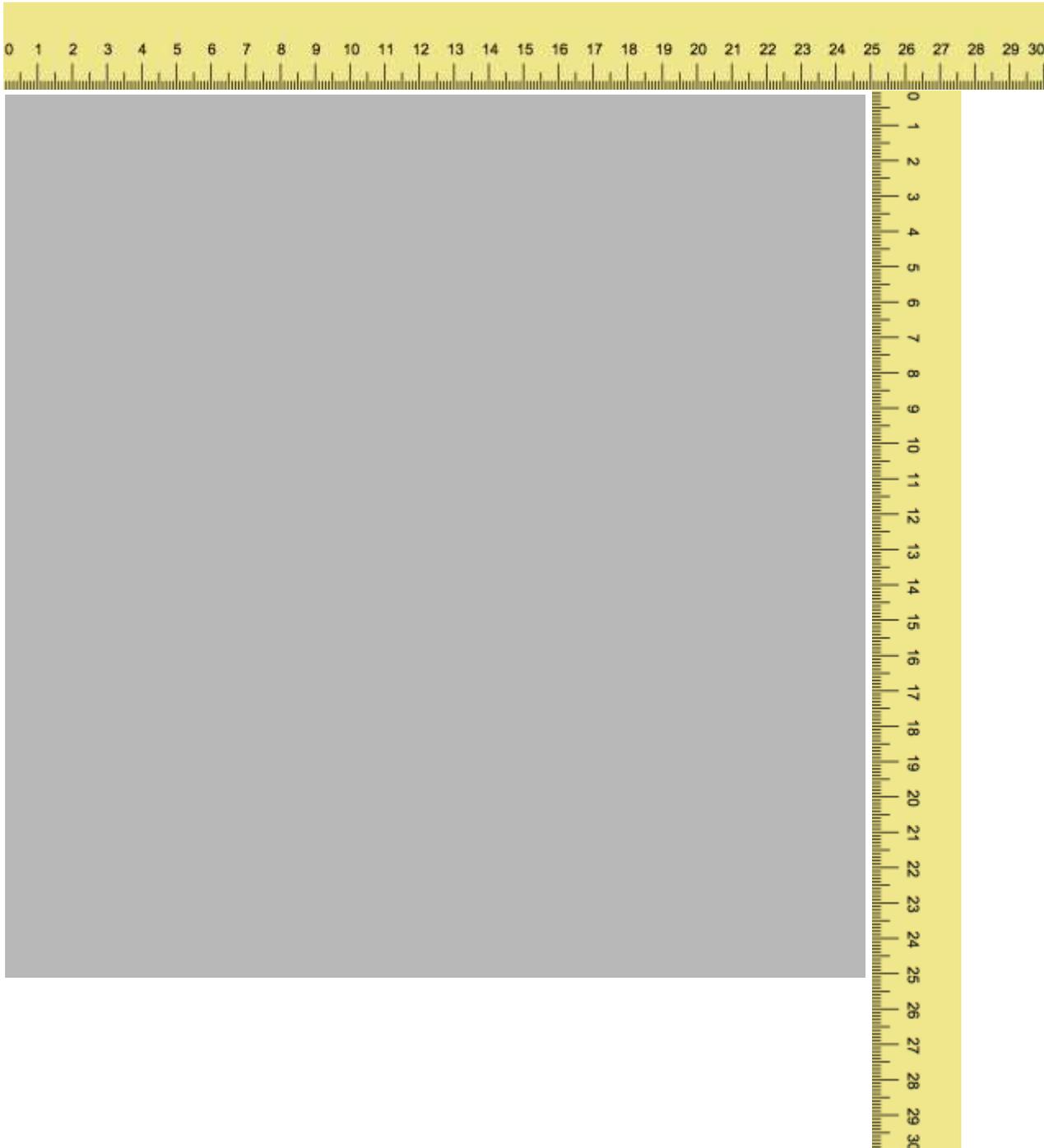

## Community Quilt Project Instructions

1. Choose the fabric you would like to use.
2. Rule 25cm across and 25cm down and mark where you will be cutting.
3. Draw your design in grey lead onto the fabric, then use whatever medium you choose to bring your design to life.



4. After you have finished your square, sign your work and drop it off to the Community House . (you might want to take a photo of your square before you drop it off.)  
Your design will be sewn together with everyone else's and hung at the Community House, put into local quilt shows, and possibly hung in Shire buildings.

## Recipe Of the Month

### *Soups and salads* Lentil soup

SERVES 4    PREPARATION 20 MINS    TO COOK 35 MINS

This hearty soup has just a touch of spice and is quick and easy to prepare. It can be puréed for a smooth finish. Serve with plenty of warm, crusty bread.

- 1 Heat the oil in a large pan over a medium heat. Add the onions, celery, and carrots. Cook, stirring, for 5 minutes, or until the onions are soft and translucent.
- 2 Add the garlic and curry powder and cook, stirring, for another minute. Then add the lentils, stock, and tomato juice.
- 3 Bring to a boil, then lower the heat, cover, and simmer for 25 minutes, or until the vegetables are tender. Season with salt and pepper and serve hot.

**INGREDIENTS**

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 2 onions, finely chopped
- 2 celery sticks, finely chopped
- 2 carrots, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1-2 tsp curry powder
- 150g (5½oz) red lentils
- 1.4 litres (2½ pints) vegetable stock
- 120ml (4fl oz) tomato juice or vegetable juice
- salt and freshly ground black pepper

## Three confirmed cases of Queensland Fruit Fly in Murrindindi Shire

The Queensland Fruit Fly (QFF) has finally made its way to Murrindindi Shire, with three confirmed cases in the last several months – one each in Trawool, Yea and Murrindindi. Murrindindi Shire Council, together with Upper Goulburn Landcare Network (UGLN), is urging both backyard gardeners and commercial growers to help manage the impacts of QFF by maintaining good



garden hygiene.

Council's Environment Portfolio Councillor Bec Bowles said that it had only ever been a matter of time before the QFF was found in our Shire, given its southern trajectory.

'This confirmed appearance of QFF in our Shire is bad news indeed. As many farmers and gardeners know, QFF is an extremely destructive pest. It attacks fruit trees and fruiting vegetables, decreasing a plant's productivity and making its fruit inedible.

'The key to containing QFF is good garden hygiene and there are a number of practices that people can implement right now. It doesn't matter if you're a backyard gardener who has a few fruit trees or you're a commercial grower with acres of orchards – everyone can play a role to help minimise the impacts fruit fly can have on our region and our produce', said Cr Bowles.

'Make sure you pick or clean up all fallen or unwanted fruit from your trees as this can attract fruit flies. In particular, they seem to love aromatic fruit, such as pears, apples and the like. You can also hang active fruit fly traps close to these types of trees to increase the chances of catching one. With your traps, make sure you check them regularly and replace your bait. Usually this is done every few months, but check the label on your trap for instructions. If you suspect you've trapped a fruit fly, please get in touch with UGLN.

'I'd also encourage you to keep an eye out for damage to your fruit. Fruit flies will often leave pin prick markings on the skin of the fruit when they lay their eggs. Once the eggs are laid, they hatch into maggots which make their way to the centre of the fruit. If you have an infestation you'll notice that your fruit will start to drop to the ground prematurely.

'If you suspect your fruit trees may have an infestation, you'll need to strip the tree of fruit, double bag it and let it sit in the sun for at least 7 days. You can then then place the bag into the rubbish. Unfortunately, once fruit flies get into your fruit, you shouldn't compost it as this won't stop them breeding and doing more damage.

'A good measure is to net your trees with insect netting after they have flowered – this helps protect them against fruit flies and other insects. We also encourage you to keep your trees pruned to a manageable size. If you have fruit that is hanging too high for you to reach, it can create a nice little un-touched home for fruit flies', said Cr Bowles.

'If you have fruit trees on your property that you don't want, I'd recommend removing them. There's no point keeping them and leaving them unchecked because they can create the perfect environment for fruit flies to multiply.

# Mother's Day in Murrindindi Shire

Mother's Day is set to look a bit different for some this year. As with ANZAC Day, we need to ensure we mark this special day, but that we do so safely for all concerned.

Murrindindi Shire Council's Deputy Mayor Margaret Rae said that some mums will be lucky enough to spend the day at home with their families, as they all live together in the one place.

'But we know many mums in our Shire are living separately from their families. The COVID-19 restrictions that are currently in place to protect everyone's health (and particularly those over 65) mean they won't be getting the normal spoiling from their immediate family they'd be expecting this Sunday. The Stage 3 restrictions are set to remain in place until the end of the declared State of Emergency on Monday 11 May, when they will be reviewed.

'We are very aware that this special day comes after almost two months of mainly staying at home, which isn't always easy, especially when it means keeping a distance from loved ones', said Cr Rae.

'But it is really important that we keep observing these restrictions, when the trends are so encouraging. It would be a real shame to see a spike in positive COVID-19 cases just when things look to be improving.

'So, instead of the normal celebration for Mother's Day, we'd encourage people to get creative in thinking how best to support those mothers who

might normally be expecting a special lunch and a well-deserved hug this Sunday.

'Why not think ahead and book a delivery of flowers through one of our local florists? If you aren't sure where they are, check out the Dindi Directory on our website which lists a number of florists who deliver across the Shire. If your Mum is good with technology, maybe put a family video message together to tell how much you love her – there is a range of online programs that can help you do this.

'Or why not post your favourite picture of you and your Mum on Facebook, or make it your profile picture for the day', Cr Rae added.

'Is your Mum a reader or would she like a selection of DVDs to watch? Give our friendly library team a call before noon Friday, and we can arrange items to be dropped off through our Book Butler service before Sunday. The team can even print off a message from you to your Mum to include in the bag of items if you send us an email at [mls@murrindindi.vic.gov.au](mailto:mls@murrindindi.vic.gov.au)

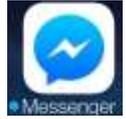

## How do I install Facebook Messenger on my iOS device? (IPad)



1. Open the App Store on your device.
2. Tap the Search button at the bottom of the screen. This opens the app search field.
3. Type in the word '**Messenger**' - a number of apps will appear in the search results. Find the app developed by 'Facebook Inc' and tap the 'get' button. .
4. Tap '**install**'. The app should then begin downloading. Depending on your security and privacy settings, you may be asked to provide your Apple ID before your device lets you download.
5. Once it is downloaded, there should be an '**Open**' button to tap in the App Store to start Facebook Messenger - or you can simply find the Messenger icon in your apps and tap that.
6. Once you have launched the app, you should be prompted to log in - you can use your Facebook account to do this if you have one, or create a Messenger-only account if you choose not to be on Facebook by clicking on '**Not on Facebook?**'. Follow the instructions on how to sign in using your phone number or email.

## How do I install Facebook Messenger on my Android device?

1. Open the Google Play Store on your device.
2. Type '**Messenger**' in the search field. A list of apps will appear.
3. Find the app developed by 'Facebook Inc' - which should be at or near the top of the list -and select it.
4. Tap the '**Install**' button. You may be asked to allow permission for Messenger to access various tools on your device. If you're happy with these, tap '**Accept**'. Depending on your security and privacy settings, you may be asked to provide your Google account password before your device lets you download the app. You may also need to be connected to a wi-fi network to download.
5. Once it has downloaded, tap the '**Open**' button on the Messenger Google Store page. Alternatively you can find it on one of your home screens or in your list of apps - launch it by tapping the app icon.
6. Login using your Facebook account, or if you don't have one tap on the '**Not on Facebook?**' button on the login screen. 9. Next just follow each page and add as much or as little information as you wish. Just continue to skip this step if you don't want to give out the information.

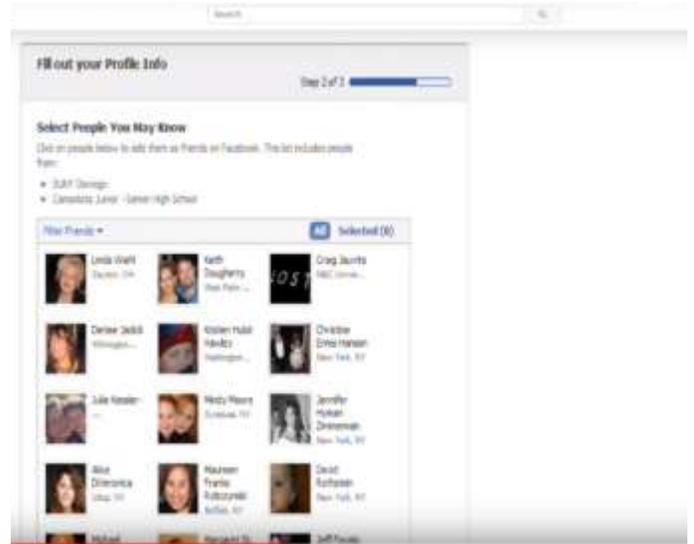

effective pest plant and animal control. It is being held on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> March 2020 at the Taggerty Community Hub.

The course usually costs around \$280, but UGLN, with funding from GBCMA, is offering the course for \$30 for Landcare members and \$75 for non-Landcare members.
